

ORDINANCE NO. 239

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OKOBOJI, IOWA, BY AMENDING/REPLACING THE WATER RATES IN SECTION 92.02(1) AND 92.02(2) AND SUBSTITUTING NEW RATES

WHEREAS, the Council (“Council”) of the City of Okoboji, Dickinson County, Iowa (“City”) is considering amendments to the Water Rates ordinance;

WHEREAS, the City is considering amending/replacing/increasing the current quarterly prepayment in the amount of \$94.00 by substituting the prepayment in the amount of **\$108.10** in Chapter 92.02(1); and

WHEREAS, the City is considering amending/replacing/increasing the current excess water billing rate, which is currently billed at the rate of \$6.16 per 1,000 gallons of water to; “Excess water shall be billed at the rate of **\$7.16** per 1,000 gallons of water... in Chapter 92.02(2); and

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Okoboji, Iowa:

SECTION 1. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Okoboji, Iowa, Section 92.02(1) is hereby amended/replaced as follows:

1. A quarterly prepayment in the amount of **\$108.10** shall be paid for a minimum use of ten thousand (10,000) gallons of water and shall become effective July 1, 2018.

SECTION 2. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Okoboji, Iowa, Section 92.02(2) is hereby amended/replaced as follows:

2. Excess water shall be billed at the rate of **\$7.16** gallons of water and shall become effective July 1, 2018.

SECTION 3. REPEALER. All Ordinances or part of Ordinances in conflict with the provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any Section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any Section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5. PUBLICATION. The City Clerk/Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to publish this Ordinance in a newspaper of general circulation in Dickinson County, Iowa in conformance with the Iowa law.


WHEREAS, a motion was made at the February 13, 2018, regular meeting after public hearing by Councilmember Robinson and seconded by Councilmember Delperdang to consider approval of this Ordinance (first consideration) and upon roll call the following vote was recorded: AYES: Delperdang, Andres, Robinson, Mendenhall; NAYS: None. Said motion to consider approval of this Ordinance (first consideration) was approved by the City Council;

WHEREAS, a motion was made at the February 13, 2018, regular meeting by Councilmember Delperdang and seconded by Councilmember Robinson to waive the second and third consideration of this Ordinance and upon roll call the following vote was recorded: AYES: Delperdang, Andres, Robinson, Mendenhall; NAYS: None. Said motion to waive the second and third consideration of this Ordinance was approved by the City Council, and therefore, the second and third consideration of this Ordinance were waived;

WHEREAS, a motion was made at the February 13, 2018, regular meeting by Councilmember Delperdang and seconded by Mendenhall to adopt this Ordinance and upon roll call the following vote was recorded: AYES: Delperdang, Andres, Robinson, Mendenhall; NAYS: None. Said motion to adopt this Ordinance was approved by the City Council. Thereupon, the Mayor declared this Ordinance, passed and approved on the date shown below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Okoboji, Iowa:
